FALLING MOON

Jungle Theatre Company Ages: 8 + Venue: NG Kerk Hall

Falling Moon is a compelling, adventurous romp through the Karoo with a delightful team of misfits, Fred, Lizo and Lena, trying to find their way in the world. They face one tremendous and seeminalv insurmountable problem: the moon has fallen out of the sky. What is to be done about it? Who will decide the moon's fate? Whose opinion matters more in making important decisions - the voice of science and reason or the voice of business and economics? And what of imagination and creativity? Is any one person's perspective more important than another's? The three characters set off on a quest to solve this problem.

As Falling Moon unfolds through deft storytelling and physical theatre the young audience learns about cooperation and teamwork: about respecting difference and the value of different points of view. They learn an important lesson about the consequences of our actions on the natural world and how to become more aware of and care for the environment. The children participate in the action helping the characters to create sound effects using with their voices. They learn movements, songs and simple dance steps to represent the different elements. The children's bodies even become the landscape through which the characters must journey and with the help of simple puppets, the characters continue on their quest. Finally it is the children in the audience who help the characters to solve their problem. Falling Moon is funded by the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund.
